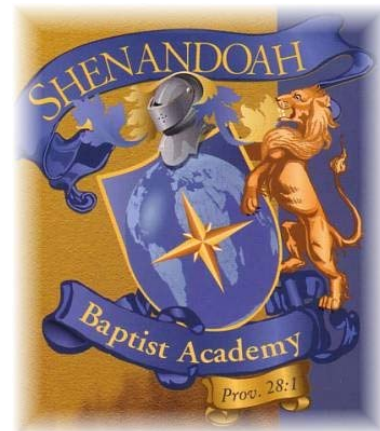

Pre-School Policy Statement

Our Preschool Program was developed for families who want a loving, Christ-centered educational program. Children are encouraged in Christian growth through Scripture memorization, daily prayer, and Bible stories. They are led by Biblical principals to discipline their lives and develop Christian character.

We believe that young children learn best by active learning. We teach the fundamentals through a hands-on, child centered approach. We are committed to provide an excellent educational program to utilize the most appropriate curriculum and methods in order to establish a creative, supportive, and wholesome environment for our students.

The preschool classes are from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. We also provide early stay beginning at 7:45 a.m. and late stay until 12:15 p.m. or 4:00 p.m. at no cost. If students remain past 12:15 p.m. or 4:00 p.m., there is a charge of \$5.00 for every five minutes.

The parent must complete all enrollment forms for the child, and a current immunization form signed by a health care provider must accompany the child upon admission. All immunizations must be current upon entry into the school.

Safety is a primary concern at Shenandoah; therefore, an adult must accompany the child into the school. If a student arrives after 8:30 a.m., the parent must sign the official sign-in sheet in the front office. If a student must leave early, a written note from the parent should be submitted to the teacher before classes begin in the morning. The parent must sign the official sign-out sheet before the student is dismissed. The school must be notified if someone other than a parent or guardian will be picking up the child. A picture identification must be presented for a child to be released. NO child will be released to a minor.

Upon arrival the child will be given a brief health check. A child may not remain at school if he/she is thought to be ill. If a child becomes ill during the day, the parent will be notified and asked to remove him/her from the school. Once sent home, a child needs to be free of symptoms for 24 hours or have a doctor's note before returning to the school. Children with a contagious illness (fever, vomiting, any drainage from the eyes and/or ears must be clear in color, etc.) may not return to the school without a signed statement from a physician, indicating the child is no longer contagious. If your child is to receive medication during the school day, the parent or guardian must have on file in the office, authorization for administration of medication. The medicine to be dispensed will be kept in the office or in the refrigerator and dispensed according to the doctor's instructions. Medicine must be properly labeled.

Parents are responsible to provide a sack lunch, morning and afternoon snack. Students may choose to purchase a hot lunch. We occasionally have special lunch or party days. You will be notified of these in advance.

To remain consistent throughout our program, we **prefer that children entering the three year old class turn three before September 30th of that school year. Children entering the four year old class must turn four before September 30th of that school year.**

Children should arrive at the school dressed for the day. **Girls** should be dressed in an oxford button up or Polo style shirt. Shirts may be solid in color or may have horizontal stripes. Skirts, jumpers, or skorts in navy, khaki, or denim that come below the knee or longer. Shorts may be worn under skirts. Tennis shoes are preferred, but during warm weather they may wear sandals. No beach shoes, flip flops, Birkenstocks, etc. **Boys** should be dressed in an oxford button up or Polo style shirt. Shirts may be solid in color or may have horizontal stripes. Boys must wear navy or khaki long pants. Jeans are permitted in blue or khaki (tan) colors. No cargo, sweat pants, carpenter pants or any other pants baggy in appearance. Pants must have belt loops and belts must be worn. Tennis shoes will be allowed for daily wear.

All four year olds must be potty trained. Due to occasional spills and accidents, one change of clothes should be sent in a labeled zip lock bag and left at the school.

We prefer that the three year olds be potty trained. If they are not, they should have no more than one accident a day. Due to occasional spills and accidents, two changes of clothes should be sent daily or to be left at the school.

In accordance with the school handbook, the school may request the withdraw of any student at any time, who in the opinion of the school does not fit the spirit of the school ministry, regardless of whether the student conforms to the specific rules and regulations of the school.

The parent agrees that Shenandoah Baptist Academy is not responsible for injuries suffered at school. A mandatory supplemental insurance policy for students will be in effect. This policy covers only what your primary health insurance policy does not cover and is included in the registration fee. Medical requirements for injuries will be the responsibility of the parent. We suggest that all students be covered under a family health insurance plan.

The Preschool classroom hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. We have an after school program from 3:30 to 4:00 p.m. The parents provide lunch, morning and afternoon snack.
